Set to become one of Transaid's largest initiatives in Africa, the Professional Driver Training – Uganda (PDTU) project commenced this summer and has been secured in partnership with the German development cooperation's GIZ E4D/SOGA – Employment and Skills for Eastern Africa, local non-governmental organisation – Safe Way Right Way, the Ugandan Government and the local private sector.
